Principal's Message...

Every June we have the opportunity to reflect on the year just passed, to celebrate our accomplishments, and to identify areas in which we want to improve. The 2009-2010 school year was extraordinary for John Hersey High School. We graduated 480 seniors. Most will be attending institutions of higher learning in the fall. Students in the senior class were accepted to colleges and universities in record numbers and they received scholarships in excess of \$1.6 million to be spent during their freshmen year. They distinguished themselves in every area of the school, from academics to fine arts to athletics, and were particularly sensitive to the needs of others, a trait they demonstrated through their service to the school and community. Their contributions have influenced our school and they will be missed. We wish them much success in all their future endeavors.



Our junior class is well situated to assume leadership as our newest senior class. They completed the state assessment (ACT) and showed that all those long hours of study and learning definitely paid off. Their achievements were astounding. We eagerly await the "official" results, but I have already done some score tabulation and know that you will be excited about this class' achievement.

While juniors were taking the ACT, freshmen were taking the PLAN and sophomores the IACT (practice ACT). Our curriculum is aligned to rigorous standards and in all our classrooms, we know that we are preparing our students to be successful citizens, both locally and globally.

Special congratulations need to go to Hersey freshmen who won the 9th grade National Geography Challenge. (This is the third time our students have won this competition.) Mrs. Mabry and Mr. Abel's Advanced Placement Human Geography students took the 50 question multiple choice exam, which included both physical and human geography questions. The top ten scores were submitted as our school score, and they were high enough to bring home the title. Out of a possible 500 points, Hersey students scored 455. Our top ten scorers were: Nicole Gregorczyk, Justin Kamp, Steven Landeweer, Frederick Lingner, Andy McDonagh, Andrew Napora, Jim Olsen, Jacob Pepe, Vivek Shah, and Alec Tchorz.

I just got back from a conference about Advanced Placement and can report that Hersey is a leader in the country in the area of advanced study. Many research reports are being released that point to the high correlation between taking Advanced Placement courses and exams and success in college. In May, we administered 1308 AP exams to over 800 9th-12th grade students. While the results are not yet available, I am confident that we will continue to perform at an extremely high level.

Next year you will find some changes here at Hersey. First, over the summer we will be undergoing some remodeling and are looking forward to the completion of our foyer. Also, we will be getting some much needed roof repairs, and some of the restrooms will be modernized. Our schedule, too, will be slightly altered. We will be migrating away from the 2 hour LATE Days. Instead, every Thursday will have a late start time for students (1st period will begin at

8:30) with the exception of 5 two-hour late starts. These specific dates can be found in the body of this newsletter. Having these LATE Days affords teachers the opportunity to work collaboratively in Professional Learning Communities to ensure that curriculum and instruction is current, relevant, and necessary for every student's achievement.

I wish to take this opportunity to welcome our newest students, Hersey freshmen. You are about to join a dynamic organization. The learning opportunities are extraordinary, but do not limit your interactions with the school solely to the classroom. There are a plethora of activities in which to become involved. I cannot recommend that highly enough. At the Freshmen Experience on August 19, you will learn about all the exciting opportunities in which you can participate during your four years at John Hersey High School.

John Hersey High School debaters captured 3rd Place, and senior Sarah Prostko made the All-State Debate Team at the Illinois Congressional Debate Association state contest.

Hersey's entry included seniors Sarah Prostko, Angelica Tillander, Mike Xiang, and junior Ted Schwaba. The Hersey debaters finished ahead of state debate powers Highland Park, Stevenson, and Deerfield, but could not catch Wheeling who captured the top prize for the second year in a row.

In addition to the team trophy, Hersey debaters excelled with individual accolades. Schwaba was voted the First Place Speaker in his division while Hersey's legislation, authored by Prostko and Tillander, captured

the Second Place Legislation Award. Also participating at the state contest were Crystal Hoover, Moriah Mulroe, Sarah Mulroe.

Prostko was selected for the second straight year to the ten-person ICDA All-State Debate Team. Earlier this year Prostko was also named to the IHSA All-State Debate Team for the second time, thus she is the only debater in school history selected as an all-state debater four times in four years.

Congratulations to Seniors Megan Anderluh and Erin Clancy

Megan Anderluh and Erin Clancy won superior rating from the Journalism Education Association for feature writing and literary magazine poetry. These students received top rating for the onsite competition, Megan was one of 3 superiors and Erin was the only superior.

Interventions and Support for Success

Healthy Living Habits

This is the perfect time to think about adopting healthy living habits. Below are a list of habits that are important for our health year round, although they often slip our minds due to the busy life style we all lead.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 60% of Americans don't get enough exercise. Summer is the perfect time to develop and maintain a good exercise plan such as walking, running, swimming, and biking. There are many benefits to regular exercise such as reducing risk of high blood pressure, heart disease, and premature death. Exercise is also a great way to relieve stress and improve your mood since physical activity stimulates chemicals in the brain that leave you feeling happier and more relaxed.

Incorporating nutritious foods into your family's diets can also have many positive effects. Eating breakfast regularly helps improve teenagers' focus and academic performance at school. Breakfast eaters are more likely to report feeling physically and mentally better than non-breakfast eaters. Additionally, try to incorporate healthy and balanced meals throughout all meals in the day, and leave junk food or unhealthy snacks as treats rather than the norm. This will help your teen make educated and healthy decisions when choosing meals.

During summer break encourage your teen to take advantage of their free time and take up a hobby that interests them. Whether it be participating in sports, taking art classes, or doing volunteer work, finding a relaxing activity can be very enjoyable and rewarding. The more teens are busy, the less time they have for trouble!

Athletes Raise Awareness on Brain Injuries

Reporter Megan Mawicke CHICAGO (CBS) writes...

Bears linebacker, Hunter Hillenmeyer, is known as one of the smartest Bears, an academic All-American from Vanderbilt. But now he's using his head to bring awareness about concussions and changes that need to be made to prevent the next generation of athletes from being harmed.

Hillenmeyer has had his bell rung more times than he can count, which is why he's helping to educate football coaches about concussions. Hunter talked at Hersey High School recently to parents and football coaches. He's one of just 12 active NFL players who have pledged to donate his brain after death to a program that studies sports brain injuries.

"That to me was a no brainer, I'll be done with it," he said. "To me, it's like signing up to be an organ donor. It's really scary stuff, especially personally for a guy who has had several concussions. You realize this is not just a need to recover from that incident, that there are long terms affects we don't know about."

Arlington Heights native Chris Nowinski started the Sports Legacy Institute, which is conducting long term effects of repeated head trauma. "Your brain can only take so many hits to the head -- there is no such thing as a tough brain," he said. Nowinski is a former Harvard football player, but multiple concussions ended his career as a professional WWE wrestler. "I know first-hand, kicked in the head too many times caused my five years of headaches, memory loss," he said. "Now long term, I have to worry about dementia at 50 years old, because of things I did as a kid when I didn't understand."

Hillenmeyer and Nowinski are hoping to tackle this problem starting with young kids since there are 3 million youth playing football. "Everybody has heard about this in the media, in the NFL, but the bigger problem is for young kids, they don't have the access to doctors, they don't have the words to tell you when they had a concussion, and frankly youth coaches have never been educated on concussions," Nowinski said.

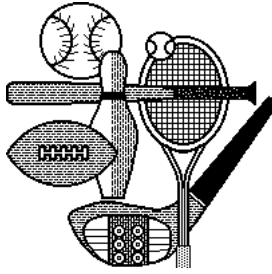
Glenn Korff, coach of the youth football team Arlington Cowboys, and parent of a football player, said the conversation has changed his thoughts on some things he does at practice. "It has changed my thoughts...or some of the expectations I put on the kids or how I design things," Korff said.

The NFL has finally used their brain implementing stricter guidelines for when players can return to the field after a concussion...but Hillenmeyer and Nowinski say the entire culture of football needs to change.

"We need to prevent the problem in young people and the way they play, change the equipment and protect kids," Nowinski said. "Long term we have to find a cure to treat the ex athletes who are walking around with problems caused by trauma."

"Hopefully, the changes we are making will spill over into college football, high school football, pop warner football, so we are saving lives," said Hillenmeyer.

Chris Nowinski is an Arlington Heights native. He has signed up more than 350 "former" athletes to donate their brains to science.

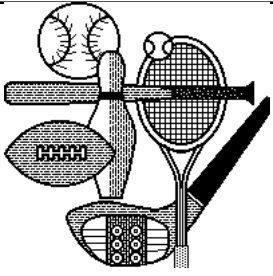

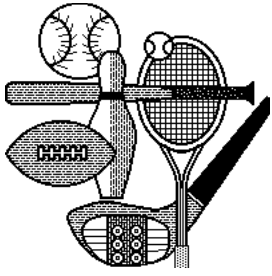

In 1999 the Illinois General Assembly passed laws requiring that public schools notify parents/guardians and school employees at least 48 hours prior to any pesticide applications on school property. The term "pesticide" includes insecticides, herbicides, rodenticides, and fungicides. The notification requirement extends to both indoor and outdoor pesticide applications. Excluded from the notification requirement are antimicrobial agents (such as disinfectants, sanitizes, or deodorizers), insecticide baits, and rodenticide baits.

All Township District 214 High Schools have therefore established a registry of people who wish to be notified.
