From the School Nurse.....Morgan Vogel

Meningitis Vaccine Requirements:

Just a reminder that all students 16 years of age and older will be required to receive a meningitis vaccine prior to entering 12th grade. Our district practices first day exclusion. If students do not provide proof of having received a meningitis vaccine by the first day of school as they enter 12th grade, they will be excluded from starting school until we receive this documentation. Students who have a medical or other reason for not receiving the vaccine must provide documentation to the health office indicating the exception.



Ronald McDonald Medical Van:



Students who are on Medicaid insurance or have no insurance coverage are eligible to participate in our Ronald McDonald Medical Van Service. They provide sports physicals, school physicals and immunizations. Please contact the Health Office at school to advise if you would like to participate or if you would like to receive further information. We highly encourage students going into 12th grade next school year who meet the requirements for participation in this service to contact the School Nurse. There will be at least

four days throughout the current school year that we will be hosting the Ronald McDonald Medical Van so there will be multiple opportunities to participate.

Chronic Health Conditions:

School achievement is dependent upon effectively meeting the health needs of each student. If your student has a chronic health condition such as asthma, severe allergies, diabetes, or a seizure disorder, it is important for the school, medical provider, and family to work together to provide the best educational experience possible.

In an effort to provide your student the opportunity for a successful school year, several healthcare plans are available on the District 214 Health Services webpage: <https://www.d214.org/Page/691>. The care plans are designed to help the school nurse collaborate with your student's medical provider and family to ensure that their healthcare needs are met.



You can print the care plan from the link listed above or go to the District 214 website and go to the Health Services tab. We ask that you do this prior to the start of each school year, as each school year we will need another care plan turned into the health office at school.

Please complete the forms with your student's medical provider and return to the Health Office at your student's school along with the medication. The medication must be in its original container or packaging or alternatively it must be in an appropriately labeled container from a pharmacy.

The school nurse is available to meet with you and your student to discuss the care plan or any concerns you may have regarding your student's health needs at school. From the School Nurse.....

Flu/Cold Information:

Influenza (the flu) is a serious illness. Symptoms can include sore throat, headache, fever, cough, nasal congestion/sneezing, fatigue, muscle/body aches and weakness. Children may also feel nauseated, vomit or have diarrhea. Cold symptoms are very similar to flu symptoms, however the **primary difference between a cold and the flu is that the flu comes on very suddenly whereas with a cold your symptoms often come on gradually.** If you suspect that either you or a loved one has the flu, it is important to seek a medical evaluation for proper diagnosis and treatment.



Transmission: The flu and cold are both caused by viruses, and both are typically spread via droplet transmission. This means that when people that are infected with the flu or cold virus and they are coughing and sneezing, they release droplets into the air that can be inhaled by other people who can then become infected. When someone coughs or sneezes, the droplets that they expel into the air can travel up to 20 feet at speeds of 25-50 miles per hour. These droplets can also stay suspended in the air for hours.

You can also get the flu from contaminated surfaces (for example - doorknobs, faucets, telephones). When you touch a contaminated surface and then touch your face, this allows the virus to enter your nose or mouth and transmit itself. Keep in mind that viruses can live on surfaces for up to 24 hours.

Treatment for the flu includes increasing water intake, potential antiviral medication (if diagnosed within 48 hours of onset) and plenty of rest. Antibiotics are ineffective against the flu and are sometimes prescribed to prevent a secondary infection related to a cold virus. Before using over the counter cold or flu treatments, please consult with your medical provider.

It is very important that you check with your child's medical provider before administering aspirin or aspirin-containing cold/flu products if your child is under 18 years of age.

Other Information: According to the CDC, people who have the flu are typically contagious from 1 day prior to becoming symptomatic and up to 7 days after becoming symptomatic. Therefore, it is very important that you stay home from work or school for approximately 7 days after symptoms begin to ensure you are no longer contagious to others. Sometimes when you begin feeling better you feel well enough to return to normal activities (including work or school), however please keep in mind that the goal is prevent others from getting sick as well which is why the CDC recommends staying home for at least 7 days from onset of symptoms.

As flu season approaches, it is important that you talk to your medical provider if you are unsure if you can receive the flu vaccine. The vaccine is generally recommended for those age 6 months and up. According to the CDC, people at the highest risk for flu-related complications are those with underlying health conditions those over 65 years of age and children under 5 years of age (especially children under the age of 2). Women who are pregnant should consult their medical provider before obtaining the flu vaccine.

Hand washing is an easy, and very important, measure that people are encouraged to implement to assist in preventing transmission of the flu or cold virus to themselves or others. Vigorous hand washing with warm water and soap for at least 15 seconds is best practice.

From the School Nurse.....

Students with Asthma and/or Severe Allergies:

Illinois State Law requires that all students diagnosed with Asthma have an Asthma Action Plan on file with their school. An Asthma Action Plan is a plan developed by you and your student's medical provider that provides the school nurse with an individualized plan of care for your student if they experience asthma symptoms (such as coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath, chest tightness or difficulty breathing).

You, your student, and the medical provider can discuss if you would like your child to carry their own emergency asthma medication at school if you would like it kept in the health office at school. The Self-Carry Form for inhalers should be completed if your student will be carrying their own inhaler. The Medication Authorization Form should be completed if your student will be keeping their inhaler in the health office. The links to all the appropriate forms are listed below. We ask that you print out the forms you need, sign/date them and have your student's medical provider complete the rest of the forms. The completed forms should be returned to the School Nurse at your student's school.



Additionally - It is very important that the school nurse be made aware if your child has a severe allergy to any food, insects, latex, or other allergens. A Severe Allergy Action Plan should be completed by you and your student's medical provider and be turned in to the Health Office at your student's school as soon as possible. 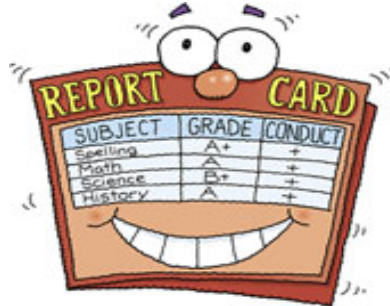

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Immunization Requirement for the 2023-2024 School Year:

For the 2023-2024 school year, **all students entering 12th grade shall show proof of having received two doses of MENINGOCOCCAL CONJUGATE VACCINE (Menactra, Menveo, MCV4) prior to starting school.** The first dose should have been administered on or after their 11th birthday and the second dose on or after their 16th birthday. An interval of at least eight weeks between the first and second dose is required. **Only one dose of the vaccine is required if the first dose is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older. You do not have to wait until your child is going into 12th grade to get the 2nd dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine - once your child turns 16 years-old they are eligible to receive it.**

Your child may have already received both doses of the required Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine, however we may not have received proof that they were given. Please check with your child's medical provider to determine if they received the two Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccines and, if they were given, please ask that they complete all information indicated below, including their signature and office stamp. **If your child has not received both doses, you are required to get this vaccination for your child or your child will be subject to exclusion as described in the school code of Illinois.**

Your child will not be able to receive their class schedule or attend school in August until all immunizations are up to date.

Please submit this completed form or an updated immunization record to the Health Office at Elk Grove High School as soon as possible.

Requisitos de Vacunación para el año escolar 2023-2024:

Para el año escolar 2023-2024, **todos los estudiantes que ingresen al 12 ° grado deberán mostrar prueba de haber recibido dos dosis de la VACUNA CONJUGADA MENINGOCOCCAL (Menactra, Menveo, MCV4) antes de comenzar la escuela.** La primera dosis debería haberse administrado en o después de su cumpleaños número 11 y la segunda dosis en o después de su cumpleaños número 16. Se requiere un intervalo de al menos ocho semanas entre la primera y la segunda dosis. **Solo se requiere una dosis de la vacuna si la primera dosis se administra cuando el niño tiene 16 años o más. No tiene que esperar hasta que su hijo ingrese al grado 12 para recibir la segunda dosis de la vacuna conjugada contra el meningococo; una vez que cumpla los 16 años, es elegible para recibirla.**

Es posible que su hijo ya haya recibido las dos dosis de la vacuna conjugada meningocócica requerida, sin embargo, es posible que no hayamos recibido pruebas de que se le dieron. Consulte con el proveedor médico de su hijo para determinar si recibieron las dos vacunas conjugadas contra el meningococo y, si se las dieron, solicite que completen toda la información indicada a continuación, incluida su firma y el sello de la oficina. **Si su hijo no ha recibido ambas dosis, se le exige que se vacune para su hijo o su hijo estará sujeto a exclusión según se describe en el código escolar de Illinois.**

Su hijo no podrá recibir su horario de clases o asistir a la escuela en agosto hasta que todas las vacunas estén actualizadas.

Envíe este formulario completo o un registro de vacunación actualizado a la Oficina de Salud de la Escuela Secundaria Elk Grove lo antes posible.

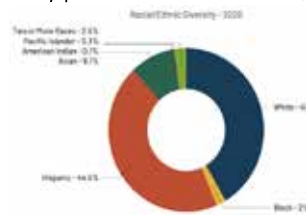

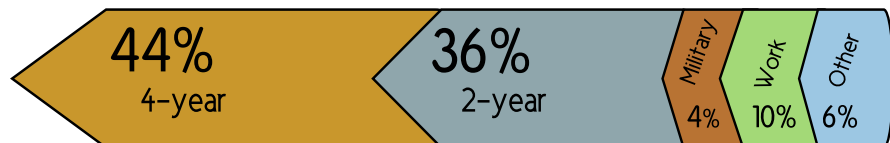

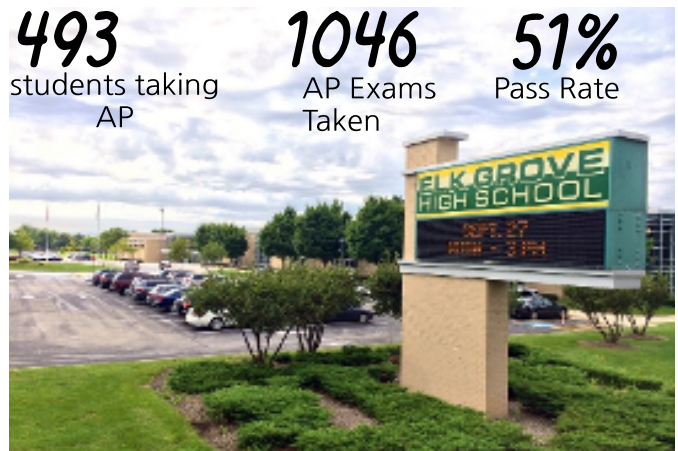
- ◆ As of the 2017/2018 school year our GPA is reported on a **4.0 scale**.
- ◆ Credit is earned in Physical Education and Drivers Ed, however those grades are not included in a student's GPA.
- ◆ D214 does not report class rank and deciles are not available.
- ◆ If a course is repeated for a higher grade, both courses are listed on the transcript. The initial grade is replaced with an "RE" and only the higher grade is factored into their GPA.
- ◆ AP courses, Dual Credit Courses as well as PLTW courses all carry AP weight. Course number will begin with a 6. 
- ◆ Elk Grove High School, along with other D214 schools, use parchment to send all electronic transcripts to accredited educational institutions or NCAA/NAIA Eligibility Center.
- ◆ Dual Credit courses are identifiable on transcripts by course number. If a number begins with a 6 it is a dual credit course
- ◆ Currently the district offers more than 80 DC courses

Under the Harper College Promise Scholarship Program every eligible incoming public high school student in Harper's district can earn an associate degree* at Harper College if they maintain solid grades, have good attendance, don't repeat classes, graduate on time and provide service to their community.

*Students can earn up to 60 credits of tuition inclusive of dual credit, AP credit and other prior credits earned. As of 2021, more than \$2.1 million in scholarship tuition has been administered to Promise students.

HOW IT WORKS

The criteria for the Harper College Promise Scholarship were developed by Harper College, area public high schools and northwest suburban business leaders to promote life skills and habits that will help students succeed in college and provide businesses with smart, skilled and motivated employees. The Promise Scholarship Program enables participating students to attend Harper without having to pay tuition[†] while they earn career certifications and associate degrees. However, signing up for the Promise program does not commit a student to go to Harper. So there's no reason not to sign up!

ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT:
