## UPDATES DUE TO COVID-19

### District 214 Update Regarding COVID-19

Please see information below regarding changes to grading policies and learning opportunities due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As of the start of the 2021-22 school year, all students attended school in-person, with no option for remote learning. Please feel free to reach out with any questions or if you would like more up-to-date information.

#### 2020-2021 School Year Changes

District 214 students worked remotely to start the school year with the plan to bring in pods of students gradually. While we mainly operated on a hybrid model, there were periods of full remote learning throughout the school year as positivity rates changed.

As of April 5, 2021, all students were welcomed back. Families were able to submit a request for a medical or household exemption and all classes were taught in a way that students could join online or in person. In-person attendance varied due to quarantine policies and student choice.

Teachers were given the option to award grades of A, B, C, D, F or P, AU, NC for all classes, including those required for graduation. P, AU and NC grades are not factored into GPAs.





## School and Community

Elk Grove High School, home of the Grenadiers, is one of six, four-year comprehensive high schools in IL High School District 214. It includes portions of the villages of Elk Grove, Des Plaines, Mt. Prospect and Arlington Heights. Elk Grove has an ethnic diverse population as presented above. The devoted staff and professional staff of teachers, counselors, coaches and support staff at EG collaborate to provide a relevant, rigorous curriculum in a safe, supportive learning environment for approximately 2,000 students. EG's curriculum program features a purposefully aligned, standards-based core sequence coupled with a vast range of elective related to preparing students for a future in any of the 16 career clusters. Our focus is on developing students into academically successful, ethical prudent young adults.

# Curriculum Levels

## General Education

Courses designed to prepare students for postsecondary education and careers.

## Honors

EGHS offers 15 rigorous honors courses for students with an outstanding record of achievement in a subject.

## College credit: Advanced Placement (AP) courses

EGHS offers 25 AP courses.

## College credit: Dual Credit courses

EGHS offers over 80 dual credit courses.

Dual credit course names have the work "college" in the title and are weighted as AP courses.

# Graduation Requirements

21 units of credit, including:

- 4 English
- 3 Mathematics
- 2 Science
- 2 Social Science
- 1 World Language OR Career and Technical Education class
- .5 Health Education
- Minimum of 3-5 days of physical education participation each semester (except when in Health Education)
- Fine Arts (pass one approved course)
- Consumer Education (pass one approved course)
- Constitution exam
- State Exam (SAT for class of 2023)

# District 214 Grading Scale & Policies

- Grading Scale: A 90-100; B 80-89; C 70-79; D 60-69; F 0-59
- Weighted and non-weighted GPA are reported on the transcript. GPA is calculated by dividing the total number of grade points earned by the total number of credits attempted.
- PE, Driver's Ed, Pass/No Credit (P/NC) and Audit (AU/AT) are not included in the GPA.
- As of the 2017-2018 academic year, G.P.A. is reported on a 4.0 scale.
- District 214 does not report class. Class rank, top GPA and GPA deciles are not available.
- If a course is repeated for a higher grade, both courses are listed on the transcript. The initial grade is replaced with "RE" and only the higher grade is factored into the GPA.
- District 214 schools do not post ACT or SAT scores on transcripts.
- District 214 staff are legally permitted to respond only to the personal questions concerning information contained in a student's permanent record.
