District 214 is a Redefining Ready school district with the goal of graduating students who are college ready, career ready and life ready.


Highlights of student experience includes:


- Every student chooses one of 16 nationally recognized career clusters to explore their potential postsecondary path.

Wheeling High School is one of six four-year comprehensive public high schools in Township High School District 214. Located in the northwest suburbs, Wheeling High School (WHS) is 25 miles northwest of downtown Chicago, Illinois. WHS serves the northwestern portion of District 214, which includes Wheeling and portions of Prospect Heights, Mt. Prospect, Arlington Heights, and Buffalo Grove.

School schedule: WHS is on an 8 period schedule (4 periods a day alternating days) with classes being 80 minutes in length. Semester classes earn .5 credits.

Curriculum Levels

Special Note: 2024-2025 AP Physics C does NOT include a lab this year and AP Physics 1 is not being offered at Wheeling High School; students were offered to stay in the class or take the following alternatives: AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science or Honors Physics.

General Education

• Courses designed to prepare students for postsecondary education and careers. These courses are offered 4.0 grade weight.

Honors

WHS offers 16 rigorous honors courses. Honors courses are offered at 4.5 grade weight and are intended to offer a more challenging academic experience covering more material at an accelerated pace.

College credit: Advanced Placement (AP) courses

WHS offers 21 AP courses. These courses along with Dual Credit courses are offered 5.0 grade weight.

<u>College credit: Dual Creit courses</u>

- District 214 offers 80+ dual credit courses. **Dual credit course** numbers begin with a "6" on the high school transcript or the word "college" and are weighted the same as Advanced Placement courses. Dual credit is a benchmark by which D214 students show career readiness. Read more about <u>College & Career Ready Indicators</u> (pages 169-170) as outlined by District 214.
- The district will also offer the AP/5.0 weight to Project Lead-the-Way (PLTW) courses

District 214 Grading Scale & Policies

- Grading Scale: A 90-100; B 80-89; C 70-79; D 60-69; F 0-59.
- Grades earned in physical education and driver education are <u>not</u> included in GPA.
- Both weighted and unweighted GPA are reported on a student's transcript with general classes weighted 4.0; honors level courses weighted on a 4.5 scale and Advanced Placement/College courses on a 5.0 scale. **See graphic for distribution -->**

• GPA is calculated by dividing the total number of grade points earned by the total number of credits attempted.

- District 214 does not report class rank class rank, top GPA, or GPA deciles.
- District 214 schools do <u>not</u> post ACT or SAT scores on transcripts.
- District 214 staff are legally permitted to respond only to the personal questions concerning information contained in a student's permanent record.
- If a course is repeated for a higher grade, both courses are listed on the transcript. The initial grade is replaced with "RE" and only the higher grade is factored into the GPA.
- PE, Driver's Ed, Pass/No Credit (P/NC) and Audit (AU/AT) are not included in the GPA.

Our School Community

Wheeling High School is a public, four-year comprehensive high school. Wheeling High School is one of six high schools the forms part of <u>Township High School District 214</u>, that includes: Buffalo Grove, Elk Grove, John Hersey, Prospect, and Rolling Meadows High Schools.

Wheeling is a culturally diverse high school. The community is varied in socioeconomics ranging from low to middle income residential, with manufacturing industries providing a major portion of the tax base. The village of Wheeling is 25 miles northwest of downtown Chicago and has approximately 39,000 residents of which 47% have achieved an Associates degree or higher, 43% of our students participate in the Free & Reduced Lunch Program, and 5.5% are homeless and designated McKinney-Vento by our school liaison.

Our Students

We are uncharacteristic of a large suburban high school. Our students are from widely diverse backgrounds, racially, socio-economically, by their country of origin, and by the primary language spoken in their home. We prize and routinely celebrate this diversity. Our recent immigrant students hail from more than 20 different countries spread throughout the globe. 65% of our senior student body self-identify as 1st generation students.

The *Class of 2024* boasted 37 members of the National Honor Society, 15 seniors who achieved an SAT of 1350+, 27 seniors graduating with highest honors, 29 with high honor, and 35 with honor. 54% of seniors reported working 10+ hours for their last two years of high school.

Your partnership with WHS

We, as you, constantly seek ways to open doors for the traditionally underrepresented college bound. Together we are well aware of the challenges and struggles this critical goal poses. With your support and assistance, both secondary and post-secondary institutions can achieve this shared goal of broader educational opportunities for those who have historically been limited in their options. Wheeling High School students and your institution can achieve the shift from possibility to probability. That is what we seek, and we are eager for continued dialogue with you to that end.

Postsecondary planning

Future plans of recent graduates indicate that about 80% continue their education in either a 2 or 4 year college setting; 45% at 4 year institutions, and 35% at 2 year colleges. 69% of the class of 2024 completed a financial aid application (FAFSA/Alternative Application). Many of our students qualify for new district initiative called Harper Promise. The Harper Promise affords students the opportunity to have 2 tuition-free years at William Rainey Harper College provided students meet college-readiness GPA standards, complete 50 hours of community service, and meet attendance requirements.

Wheeling High School, is taking action to encourage and expand options for the postsecondary educational opportunities for students. Students can participate in D214's Early College Center through Arizona State University's online programming as well as Middle College programs through Harper Community College and National Louis University. Students also have opportunity to earn a Illinois Seal of Biliteracy through the State of Illinois. We provide opportunities for students to take dual credit classes in both core and elective subjects through our partnerships with Eastern Illinois University, Lewis University, and Triton College, College of DuPage, and Morraine Valley College. Students are highly encouraged to pursue dual credit career pathway courses and have workplace learning experiences as well as obtain industry credentials. D214 offers 40 industry certifications ranging from automotive technology, information systems, health careers (CNA), hospitality and tourism, manufacturing, and many more.
