



**D214 EARLY COLLEGE CENTER
HONORS PROGRAM
ECC application**

District 214 students will have the opportunity to participate in an honors program that can earn them up to **19 early college credits** in partnership with Arizona State University and its Freshman Global Academy online platform. This program offers co-enrollment for up to two online courses per quarter, guided by a District 214 teacher. Students will earn District 214 credit and have the opportunity to transcript the ASU credit.

PROGRAM SELECTION

The Early College Center is open to incoming District 214 seniors with the demonstrated ability to work independently and succeed in college-level work. Interested students must complete and submit the attached application by February 12th. Selection will be based on interest, academic readiness and counselor recommendation.

COURSES

Students in the cohort enroll in the same 8-week ASU course every quarter, working together to encourage further collaboration and real-world college study skills. Based on the ASU course sequence, students participating in the program will earn high school honors credit for one year of English, one year of math, two semesters of social science and one semester of a lab science. Courses options will include:

Human Origins
Introduction to Sociology
Introduction to Solar Systems, Astronomy
Macroeconomics
Pre-Calculus
College Algebra

English 101
English 102
Communications 100

REGISTRATION/TUITION

Students must pay Arizona State University's \$50 registration fee per course. There also is a per-course charge to ensure the courses are transcribed for college credit. Students selected for the cohort will be awarded scholarships to significantly reduce that cost to \$300 per course. Students who have financial need will be eligible for additional assistance. Transcription is not required.

Online tuition at Arizona State University typically could cost about \$600 per credit hour. This reduced fee helps greatly reduce barriers to college access and affordability.

HOW IT WORKS

Students in the cohort will attend their home high school for part of each day, completing physical education and career-related and other required electives for graduation. Students will then report to Forest View Educational Center, the District's office in Arlington Heights for the other part of the day. During the 2018-2019 school year, we will offer both morning and afternoon sessions. This is a blended learning program. Attendance may not be required each day and will be tied to success in the program. **Transportation is not provided.**
