Request of Open Campus Permission

Permission to leave the school campus during the 2021/2022 School year, is a **PRIVILEGE** that *may* be extended to all students. Township High School District 214 students who are granted open campus privileges may only leave campus during open study hall/open periods. In order for students to obtain open campus privileges, they must meet the criteria listed below.

Before granting permission, please give careful consideration to the following:

1. Students are supervised while on school premises.
2. Tutorial centers, guidance and counseling services, library services and lunches are available in school. Parents should consider other personal factors before granting off-campus permission. In granting this permission, parents take responsibility for students' conduct, whereabouts and welfare off campus.

Township High School District 214 has determined that the following criteria must be met in order for a student to be eligible for open campus privileges:

1. No F's on their previous semester report card.
2. Students must *not* be assigned extra assistance due to poor academics.
3. No out of school suspensions the previous semester or current semester.
4. Students must have parental permission on file to leave campus.

Open campus permission is a privilege, not a right, and may be revoked by the student's parent or an administrator at any time. The District also reserves the ability to adjust criteria at any time.

Listed below are some of the reasons why open campus permission may be denied or revoked:

1. Failure to meet student expectations.
2. Any misconduct or attendance problem related to the open campus privilege.
3. Presence at another school without permission while off-campus.
4. Students who demonstrate negative behavior, discipline, and/or attendance incidents (tardies, cuts, truancy, etc.) may be **denied** open campus privileges.
