Auto Acceleration refers to state legislation that requires the automatic placement of students that meet or exceed standards into the next most rigorous level of coursework.

What is the difference between college preparatory, honors, and advanced placement?



College Preparatory Non-Weighted (4.0/4.0)

College Preparatory courses are taught at grade level and prepare students for access to early college experiences and post-secondary opportunities.

Honors Weighted (4.5/4.0)

Honors courses are intended to offer a more challenging academic experience covering **more material** at an **accelerated pace**. These courses are designed for students who excel in certain subjects and are comfortable **working independently**.

Advanced Placement Weighted (5.0/4.0)

Similar in rigor to honors courses.
This course follows the College
Board's guidelines for the subject's
course. This course prepares student
to take the advanced placement
exam with the potential to earn
college credit depending on the
student's performance.

How will I know if my student has been 224 auto accelerated?



You received an email from the District indicating subject areas your student has qualified for auto acceleration.





After the student course selection process, parents will receive a course schedule verifier to review and confirm their student's course selections. A link to the opt-out form will be included in this communication.

What do I need to do now?



- Nothing, if you want your student advanced in all courses in which they qualify.
- We encourage students to work with their teachers, counselors, and parents/guardians to consider the impact of all available options.

What if my student wasn't automatically accelerated?



- Our goal is to support our students in finding balance among academics, activities, sports, and time with friends and family.
- We work hard to place each individual in the courses that best reflect their goals and aspirations.
- Through the course selection process, we consider grades, test scores, career pathways, and other future goals.
