Welcome to the 2021-22 school year. The first full day of classes will be **Wednesday, August 11, 2021.**

Online Registration:

Due to the global COVID-19 pandemic and the economic burden put on many families, the D214 Board of Education has voted to waive the 2021-22 registration fee (\$425) and co-curricular fees. These fees will be suspended until further notice for ALL students. **The Senior Fee of \$40 will not be waived.**

Students on a fee waiver (see **Waivers**) will have remaining applicable fees waived. However, any pre-existing fees or obligations can still be paid via online payments using a credit or debit card (i.e. MasterCard, Discover or Visa) in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Click here:

When registering please follow the directions on the website and verify that demographic information, especially your email address, is updated and current.

Residency:

Freshman Students: If you have not turned in a Birth Certificate and/or if you are notified that you have not proven Residency, you will NOT be able to complete the registration process.

Sophomore, Junior, Senior Students: If you are notified that you have not proven Residency, you will NOT be able to complete the registration process.

Health Exams, Dental Exams, and Immunization Records:

Freshman Students: Freshman Students must submit the following:

- current physical exam (the physical form should be dated on or after August 11th, 2020)
- dental exam
- appropriate immunization records

Senior Students: All 12th grade students must submit the following:

- Proof of two doses of MENINGOCOCCAL CONJUGATE VACCINE (Menactra, Menveo, MCV4 - the first dose shall have been received on or after the 11th birthday; second dose on or after the 16th birthday, an interval of at least eight weeks after the first dose. Only one dose of the vaccine is required if the first dose is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older.)

Please note that students will NOT receive their class schedule and will be excluded from school in August until required health information is submitted.

Driver's Education:

Driver's permit processes will begin the first day of school during Driver Education Class. Please bring \$20 CASH for the permit application/license fee and be prepared to take vision and written tests. All school fees and obligations must be paid prior to the start of school.

Note: Payment for Driver's Education Behind the Wheel is not available during the registration. You will need to pay on the portal.

Transportation:

Bus transportation is free for students living beyond 1.5 miles from school. This service is automatic and does not require a separate application. Students not eligible for free transportation may purchase this service (\$675 for the first student and \$550 for each additional student for the 2021-2022 school year) based on seat availability on regular routes. Please contact the main office for more information. Students are required to show their ID card to the bus driver starting the second week of school. There are two after school buses for students: Activity Bus at 4:30 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday only and Athletic Bus at 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Student Accident Insurance:

Enrollment forms for coverage through 1st Agency Insurance Company are available in the Main Office or on the registration portal website.

Physical Exam & Immunization

Requirements

Now is the time to make an appointment if you have not already done so!

High School District 214 has a first-day exclusion policy. All students must be in compliance with all required physical examinations and immunizations prior to the first day of school attendance. Students who are out of compliance will not receive their schedule and will be excluded from school until verification of immunizations and physical exam is received by the school nurse.

FRESHMAN

1. A physical examination is required for all 9th students. The exam must be completed within one year of the first day of school (The physical form must be dated on or after August 11th, 2020). The required physical examination/immunization form can be found at:

SENIORS

All 12th grade students shall show proof of having received two doses of MENINGOCOCCAL CONJUGATE VACCINE (Menactra, Menveo, MCV4) prior to entering the 12th grade. The first dose shall have been received on or after the 10th birthday; second dose on or after the 16th birthday. An interval of at least eight weeks after the first dose. Only one dose of the vaccine is required if the first dose is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older.

Please note that 9th and 12th grade students will NOT receive their class schedule and will be excluded from school in August until this required health information is submitted.

ATHLETES

All students participating in sports are required to have a current physical on file. Physicals are good for 13 months from the date of the exam. Please

submit these physical forms as soon as possible so that materials may be processed in time for the start of athletics in August.

Your student is enrolled in an English course for the upcoming school year. Township High School District 214's English courses provide instruction and skill development focused on the areas of reading, writing and critical thinking skills. In the area of reading, English teachers will provide contextual and literary analysis experiences that enhance student's personal connections to the text. A specific reading strategy included in this instruction is **annotation**. Annotation encourages critical reading through the use of symbols, marginal notes, essential questions, and connections both to and in the text. The process of annotation allows students to maximize these personal connections in order to create meaning, analyze, and interact with text in a way that is vital to their understanding. District 214 students will be afforded the opportunity to examine text closely and critically through the use of their own paperback novel(s). The attached list includes the title and ISBN number for the novels required for purchase in each English course at your student's high school. Each listing indicates the semester in which the novel will be read. This will assist with your purchasing timeline. Students eligible and approved for a fee waiver will have the materials provided for them.

If a course indicates "Not Applicable" there are no materials required for purchase.

Students and parents are free to purchase the listed paperback novels at any retail or online vendor, i.e., Amazon.com, in order to access the best available pricing. In an effort to provide you with options for purchase we have worked with two book vendors who have worked with the district to make inventory available for all listed materials. Multiple options are available which include in store purchase and online purchase with delivery to your home. We hope that this information is of assistance to you.

We are excited about the upcoming school year and look forward to your student's continued learning.

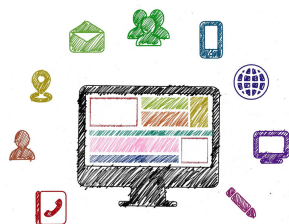
