Summer Experience Programs

Credit Recovery Program: academic coursework options for students who need to recover credit or want to repeat a course to enhance their understanding of a subject. In-person and online formats are available.

Get Ahead Program: academic coursework options for students who want to get ahead on graduation requirements or prepare themselves for academic success. In-person and online formats are available.

By Invitation Program: invitation-only programs addressing the unique needs of specific students.

Driver Education Program: for students who are 15 years of age by May 1, and who want to meet the State prerequisite for obtaining a Driver's License.

Enrichment and Career Pathways Program: non-academic courses in diverse subjects for all District 214 students who want to explore new interests, develop new passions and investigate different careers.

Important Registration Information

BE PREPARED TO MAKE FINAL COURSE DECISIONS WHEN YOU LOG ON

To ensure a successful registration experience, please be prepared to select the courses you intend to purchase and complete the process within 10 minutes of placing your first course into the shopping cart.

When a course is selected and put in the shopping cart, a seat is essentially "on hold" for the purchaser. If the registration payment process is not completed within 10 minutes the seat "hold" is lifted, the course is removed from the shopping cart and that seat becomes available to other purchasers.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU NEED COUNSELOR APPROVAL

When a student registers for a credit recovery course, the system will verify that the student has previously taken and failed the course. If the failed course is not found on the student's transcript a message will appear indicating that counselor approval must be granted before proceeding with registration. If you see this message, please select the "Request" option.

Requests will be reviewed beginning April 1, 2024. You will receive an email with the result of the review and if appropriate you will be directed to proceed with registration. If the request has been approved, the course will be placed in the student's recommended course list.

FEE/MEAL WAIVERS AND SUMMER EXPERIENCE FEES

Students approved for fee/meal waivers for the 2023-24 school year will also have summer course fees waived, with the exception of the registration fee, unless registering during the Early Bird period. Students approved for reduced fees/meals for the 2023-2024 school year will not have fees waived, with the exception of the registration fee if registering during the Early Bird period.

THE REGISTRATION SYSTEM WILL WAIVE FEES WHEN APPLICABLE

If you have not completed a school meal application with District 214 for this school year and believe you are eligible, please visit the **Food and Nutrition** page to learn more. We recommend completing this step prior to registering your student in summer school. Once the meal waiver application is processed, you can return to the Summer Experience registration site to proceed with the registration and take advantage of fee waivers for approved applicants.

NCAA REGISTERED STUDENTS

Students who are registered or plan to be registered with the NCAA should consult with their counselor before enrolling in Credit Recovery courses.
