## **GRENS FIRST DAYS**

"Yay!! We're so excited to go back to school!" may not be something you hear your child say as the school year grows closer, but the staff at Elk Grove High School have been hard at work trying to make this upcoming school year a successful one. For many kids, these last two school years have been very difficult. To help kids feel more comfortable, the staff at EGHS will take 30 minutes of each class period during the first week of school to focus on topics like: how to manage your time better, what to do when you notice that you need help in class, understanding our new cell phone policy, and other fun activities to help kids get to know one another. Research shows that when kids feel more connected and comfortable in school, they do better in their classes. Our goal is to help build that connection and set them up for lifelong success. So even if your kids aren't excited to be back, we're excited to welcome them back and start the school year off right!

## **HOW TO HELP THE EMOTIONAL CHILD**

We've all been there; feeling at a complete loss when our children are having an emotional breakdown and nothing we say or do seems to do any good at all. Reassurances that things aren't as bad as they seem, or that things will be ok don't calm them down; and getting them to think through the problem are met with more anger or "you don't understand!". It can be a helpless feeling for a parent. Our own frustrations might seep in and we might find ourselves getting emotional too; which can make things really interesting! So, what are we to do?

While the individual reasons why our children are so upset can be very different, one helpful thing to do in these types of situations is listen and try to validate how they are feeling or what they are going through. When children feel like they are understood and are able to put words to strong emotions, they become calmer; which then allows them to think more clearly. Anytime we are upset, we want to be understood and validated first. Think back to a time when you might have been upset with someone (maybe your partner or significant other), and imagine how it would feel if you were talking to a friend and the first thing they said was "yeah, but I think they're right, what you did was wrong". Maybe your friend makes a good point--maybe you needed to hear that, but in that moment we are likely to get more upset--to feel like our friend isn't listening or doesn't understand.

With our children it's hard because we often feel like we know them and think we know the real reasons why the are upset. Maybe we do, or maybe we don't; but we'll probably have much more success calming them by approaching the situation with curiosity and a desire to make them feel understood. Validating our children's feelings and making them feel listened to is not the same as agreeing with them, or letting them do whatever they want. We can still understand them and hold them accountable. After we take the time to listen, we can say, for example "so, I heard that you are feeling \_\_\_\_, but we also need to do \_\_\_\_, so given that you are down here, and need to get up here, how can we do that?".

Once our children are calm, they become more rational and better able to think and problem-solve. We can still tell them what they need to hear, and hold them accountable, but we might have an easier time doing it (with a little less yelling) if we seek to understand their perspective first.

- Obtaining data to enrich the curriculum and instruction
- Providing information for making post-secondary educational and vocational decisions

### District 214 is committed to:

- Providing frequent, purposeful, appropriate, and fair assessments accompanied by timely feedback.
- Helping students and parents make good use of assessment data in the decision making processes.
- Training staff to understand and effectively utilize assessment data.

Township High School District 214 coordinates district-wide assessment programs for high school students:

- State of Illinois Assessment Program that complies with the requirements of the State Board of Education.
- College-Bound Assessments aid students in making decisions with regards to their college plans. These are
  assessments such as the National ACT and SAT where students register for the test online.

# **HOW IT WORKS**



# Immunization Requirement for the 2022-2023 School Year:

For the 2022-2023 school year, <u>all students entering 12th grade shall show proof of having received two doses of MENINGOCOCCAL CONJUGATE VACCINE (Menactra, Menveo, MCV4) prior to starting school.</u> The first dose should have been administered on or after their 11<sup>th</sup> birthday and the second dose on or after their 16th birthday. An interval of at least eight weeks between the first and second dose is required. Only one dose of the vaccine is required if the first dose is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older. You do not have to wait until your child is going into 12th grade to get the 2nd dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine - once your child turns 16 years-old they are eligible to receive it.

Your child may have already received both doses of the required Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine, however we may not have received proof that they were given. Please check with your child's medical provider to determine if they received the two Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccines and, if they were given, please ask that they complete all information indicated below, including their signature and office stamp. If your child has not received both doses, you are required to get this vaccination for your child or your child will be subject to exclusion as described in the school code of Illinois.

Your child will not be able to receive their class schedule or attend school in August until all immunizations are up to date.

Please submit this completed form or an updated immunization record to the Health Office at Elk Grove High School as soon as possible.

# ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT:

# INFORMATION REGARDING "EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS" AND ELK GROVE HIGH SCHOOL

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (also known as the Every Student Succeeds Act or ESSA) is a federal law meant to ensure that all school children, whatever their economic background, can achieve high academic standards. Because of this law, Elk Grove High School receives funding from the federal government in the form of Title I and Title II-A grants. The Title I grant is awarded to the school based on the number of low-income students enrolled. This grant supports programs for children who are at risk of failing. The Title II-A grant helps pay for teacher training and professional development. Title grant funding covers part of the cost of programs at Elk Grove such as supplementary tutoring, field trips to college campuses, summer reading books, Collegepalooza, Estudiantes Unidos, and parent outreach.

ESSA also says that parents have a right to know about the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers. You can ask for information about teachers' licensing and academic degrees. You also have the right to know whether your child is being provided services by paraprofessionals and what their qualifications are. We are pleased to report all teachers in District 214 are highly qualified, as defined by the Illinois State Board of Education. Highly qualified teachers have a bachelor's degree or higher and a state teaching license. In addition, for each core subject area of teaching responsibility, all teachers have either passed a content-area test or completed a college degree in that subject. All paraprofessionals are endorsed by the state as paraprofessional educators, having completed at least 60 semester hours of college credit or the equivalent. If this situation ever changes, you will be notified promptly.

Elk Grove High School and District 214 encourage you to become involved in your child's education, as outlined in the accompanying School-Parent Compact. You are invited to attend the annual Title I meeting and parent-teacher conferences, and you are also encouraged to join groups such as the Parent Teacher Council and Padres Unidos. A schedule of parent activities is published in the quarterly newsletter and on the school website. It is district policy that parents, staff and students share the responsibility for improved academic achievement.

ESSA también dice que los padres tienen derecho a saber acerca de las cualificaciones profesionales de los maestros de sus hijos. Usted puede pedir información sobre las cualificaciones de los maestros de su hijo/a, incluso sus licencias y títulos universitarios. Usted también tiene el derecho de saber si su hijo/a está recibiendo servicios de un asistente y cuales son sus cualificaciones. Nos da gusto informarle que todos los maestros en el Distrito 214 están altamente cualificados, según la definición de la Junta Educativa del Estado de Illinois. Los maestros altamente cualificados tienen al menos una licenciatura (bachelor's degree) y una licencia estatal de enseñanza. Además, para cada asignatura principal que el maestro enseña, él/ella ha pasado un examen estatal o ha completado un título universitario en esa materia. Todos los asistentes del Distrito 214 son aprobados por el estado como educadores paraprofesionales, con al menos 60 horas de estudio universitario o el equivalente. Si esta situación cambia, usted será notificado lo más pronto posible.

Elk Grove High School y el Distrito 214 les recomiendan que se involucren en la educación de su hijo/a, así como se describe en el Pacto adjunto. Se le invita a asistir a la reunión anual de Título I y a las conferencias individuales con sus maestros, y también se le alienta a unirse a grupos como Padres Unidos y el Parent Teacher Council. # Students amass nearly \$90,000 in scholarship awards



The District 214 Education Foundation in the spring distributed nearly \$90,000 in postsecondary scholarships to more than 70 graduating seniors from all District schools.

Among the highlights were the Redefining Ready! Awards, which required applicants to create 30-second videos showing why they are college, career and life ready beyond a test score. Students did so in various ways, including through songs and video animation showing off their activities, achievements outside the classroom, early college credit opportunities and more.

In addition, this year the Foundation launched four (4) new scholarships ranging in focus from a student intending on pursuing a degree in the Transportation field (Auto/Aviation) to a student intending on pursuing plans after graduation: participation and/or commitment to the Arts, with plans to pursue teaching or life in the Arts.

Scholarship applications for the upcoming school year will open in mid-January, and students once again will be able to apply for most of them through a one-stop online portal that, based on their answers to screening questions, provides them a list of the scholarships for which they're qualified and allows them to apply directly online.

The District 214 Foundation provides a variety of opportunities for funding the future. 
# **Community Education Fall Program**

- 2. Enter your student username which is:
  - First initial of first name

+

- Last name up to 15 characters long

+

- Last four digits of student ID number

Example - Taylor Swift with ID number 821234

Username would be tswift1234

- 3. Enter your student password which is Date of Birth in following format:
  - mmddyy
- 4. You will be prompted to accept Google's Terms of Service and Privacy Policy.
- 5. Once accepted, you will have access to your school email account.

NOTE: email address is username@stu.d214.org






