## **SOPHOMORES: Digital PSAT 10**

The state required digital PSAT 10 is aligned with and prepares students for the other tests in the SAT suite of assessments.

PSAT 10 Testing Information: <u>PSAT 10 Student Guide.</u> It is designed to specifically evaluate current Sophomores in high school. The purpose is to benchmark students and evaluate college preparedness.

Scores are typically available 6 weeks after the test through the student's College Board account. Detailed testing information will be sent in March via school email.


